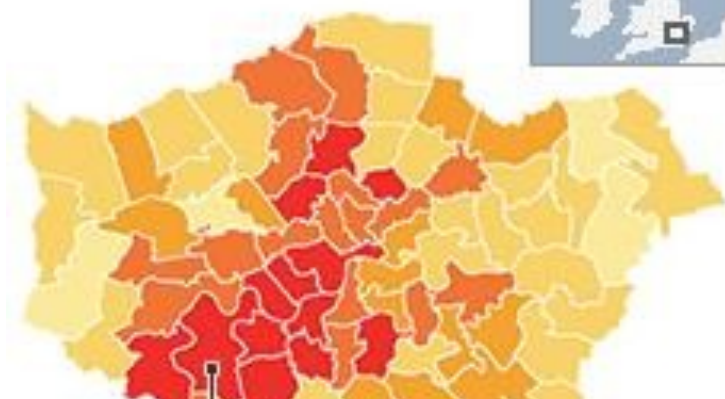

Areas where people have at least one degree or equivalent

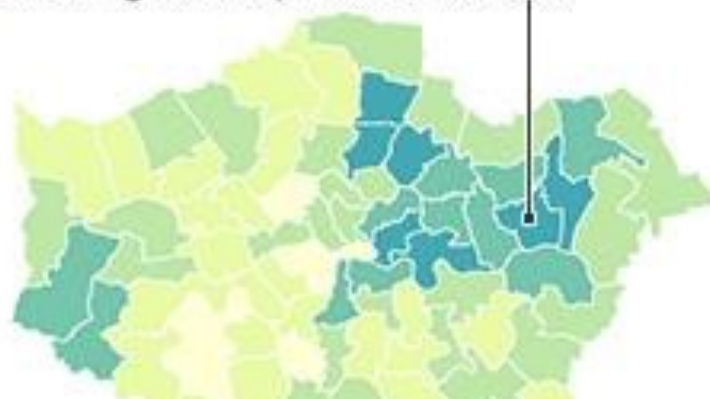

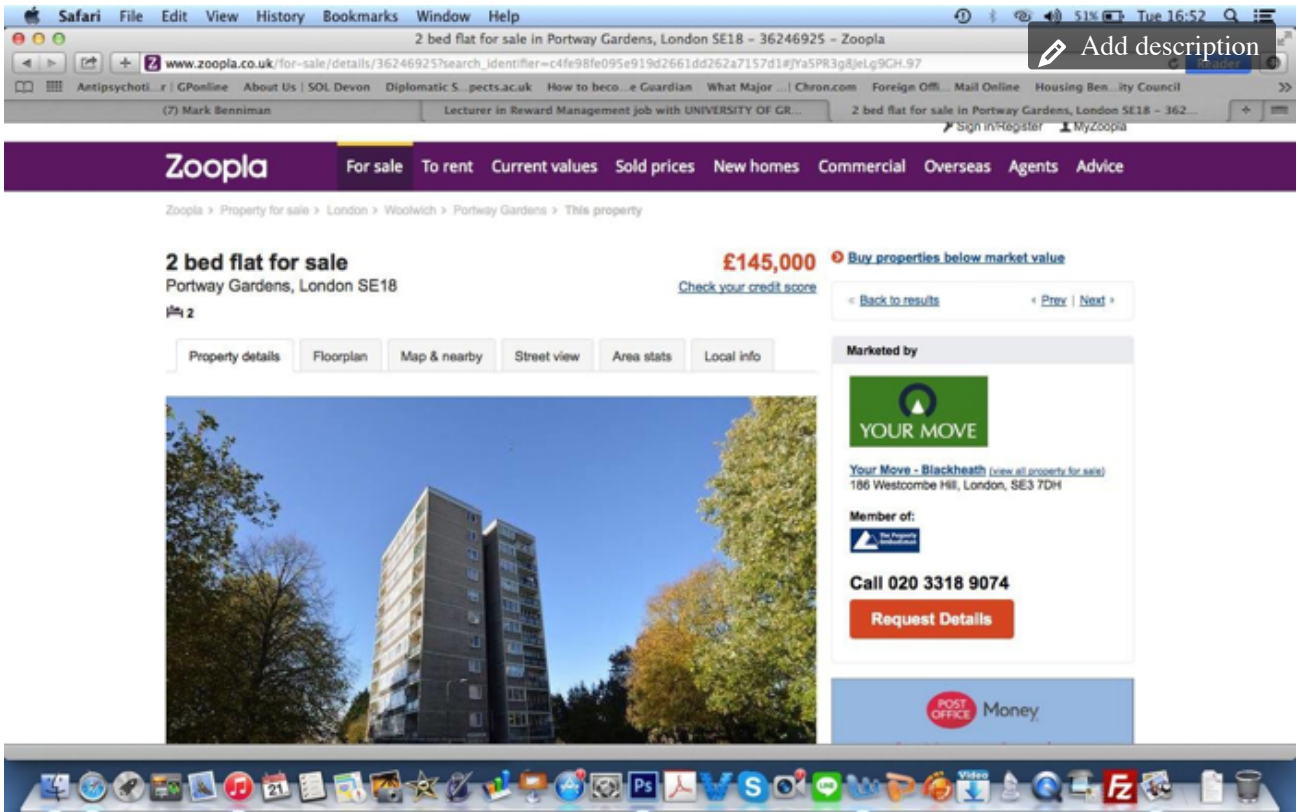

We have our job but hurry only six days left to apply

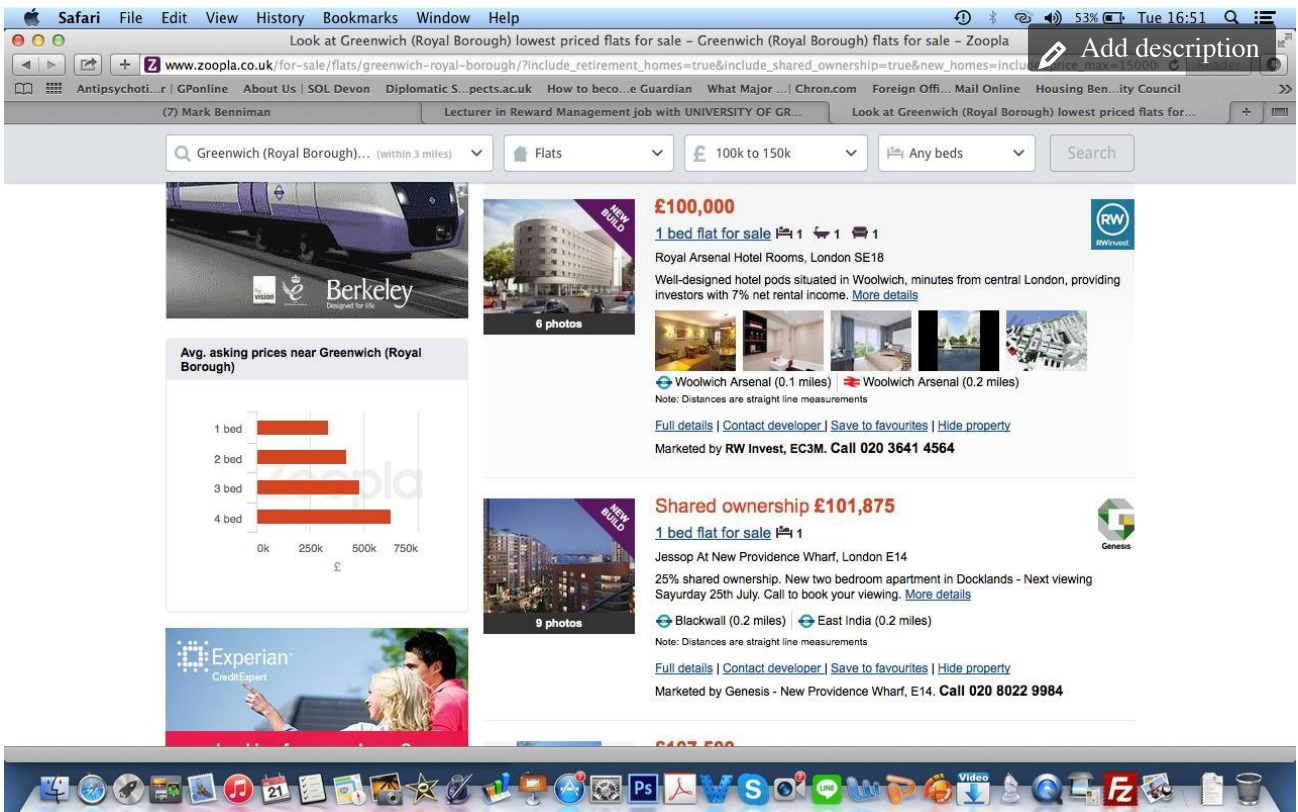

Fresh as a loaf of bread, this is the ceiling, by chance it seems to be in Del Trotter's tower block.

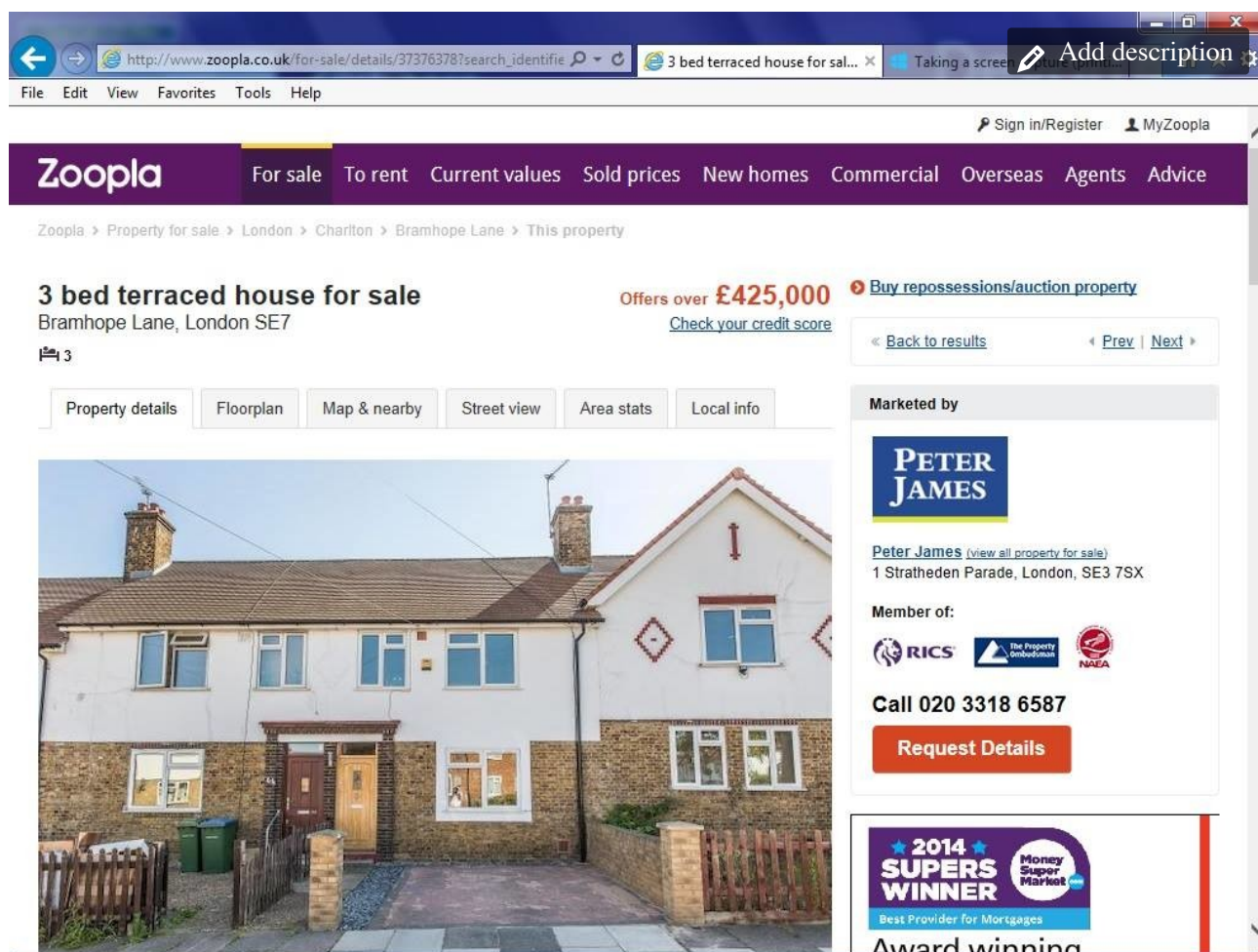


The very cheapest property in the area was a bubble in a hotel in Woolwich

But they would have invested maybe a few hundred grand in their education?

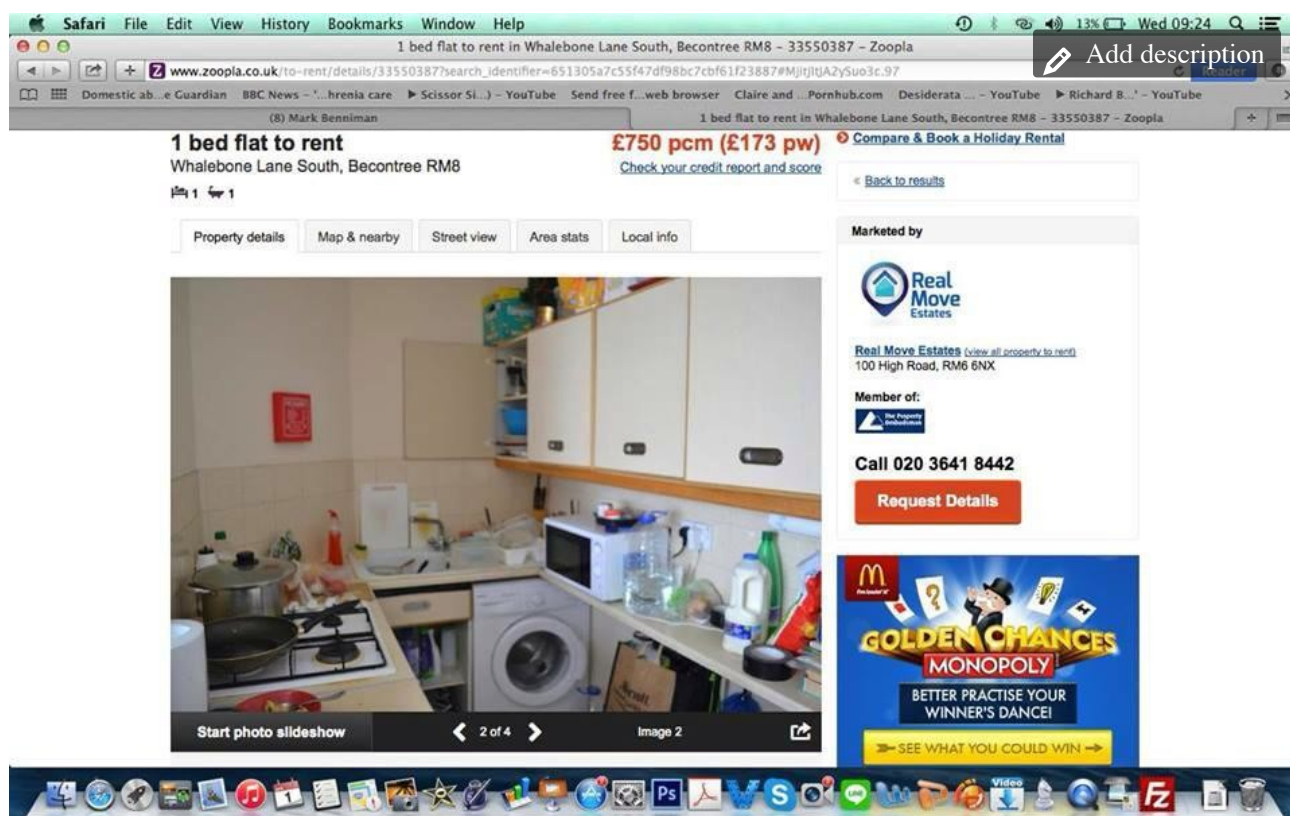
Leading experts

I wanted it looking really nice?



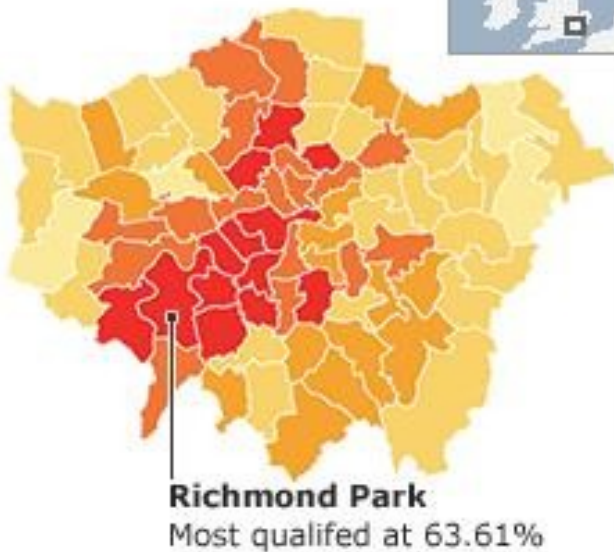
